After the audit, employees of Sofia Airport EAD have completed a training on the application of the GDPR. All necessary procedures, rules and policies in relation to personal data protection in the context of the operations of Sofia Airport EAD which are required under the GDPR, have been prepared and will be provided officially to Sofia Airport EAD until 7 September 2018 by the law firm Ilieva, Vucheva & Co. A technical audit of the infromation systems of Sofia Airport EAD is underway. Once both audits are completed, all procedures, rules and policies in relation to personal data protection prepared by the two consulting companies will be submitted for approval by the Executive Board of Sofia Airport EAD.

Yes, there has been an external audit of Sofia Airport EAD on the activities and procedures for personal data processing in connection with the entry into force of GDPR, carried out by the law firm Ilieva, Vucheva & Co. There is a report with the results of the external audit for legal compliance which contains elements of the National Civil Aviation Security Program and is sensitive infromation including sensitive data. An external audit by the Amatas company of the information systems of Sofia Airport EAD is underway, concerning the activities and procedures for personal data processing in relation to the entry into force of GDPR.

Sofia Airport EAD is in the process of implementing the requirements of the GDPR and has not yet completed the adoption of the full documentation in relation to personal data processing based on an external audit carried out by the law firm Ilieva, Vucheva & Co. concerning the activities and procedures for personal data processing in relation to the entry into force of GDPR. After the audit, employees of Sofia Airport EAD have completed a training on the application of the GDPR. All necessary procedures, rules and policies in relation to personal data protection in the context of the operations of Sofia Airport EAD which are required

		under the GDPR, have been prepared and will be provided officially to Sofia Airport EAD until 7 September 2018 by the law firm Ilieva, Vucheva & Co.

6.		Yes, Sofia Airport EAD does process personal data of individuals on the basis of consent for data processing. Sofia Airport EAD collects data on the first names, family names, emails and phone numbers of individuals for the purposes of sending news, carrying out promotional campaigns in the airport retail outlets and other commercial communications in relation to the operations of the company. Sofia Airport EAD collects data of individuals under the age of 16 and their parents for the purposes of carrying out organized school visits to Sofia Airport EAD, because such data are necessary for the issuance of passes granting access to the critical area of the restricted-access zone. Once the two audits are completed, all procedures, rules and policies in relation to personal data protection prepared by the two consulting companies will be submitted for approval by the Executive

		Board of Sofia Airport EAD. There are procedures developed on how to implement the requirements of the GDPR in the above cases and the said procedures are complied with in the context of the operations of Sofia Airport EAD.

The company collects special categories of personal data – personal data concerning health and personal data relating to criminal convictions and offences. Medical certificates are collected upon an express request by the company. The documents containg special categories of data are: medical certificates, copies of documents for temporary work incapacity, health status data, including individuals' height, weight, past diseases, a psychiatric certificate that the relevant employee is not kept on record, including a mental health certificate following a conducted interview, as well as additional data on diseases provided by occupational medicine services, and expert decisions by Territorail expert medical committees (TEMC). The Company also collects certificates of conviction which employess are expressly required to submit and which the company keeps after collection. The certificates of conviction contain the names of the relevant employees' parents.

Sofia Airport EAD keeps and processes personal data of individuals visiting Terminal 1 and Terminal 2 in relation to the provision of emergency medical care. The processing of personal data in the record is carried out for the purpose of ensuring medical services for flights, including for passengers, visitors to and employees of Sofia Airport EAD.

The legal basis for the processing of personal data is compliance with a legal obligation of the controller (Article 6 (1) (c) of GDPR) arising from Ordinance No. 3 on emergency and rescue provision, and is necessary in order to protect the vital interests of the data subject or of another natural person (Article 6 (1) (d) of the Regulation).

The data processed in connection with providing emergency medical care are the following:

- a) First name, middle name, family name;
- b) Gender;
- c) Age;
- d) Nationality;
- e) Time of occurrence of the relevant incident;
- f) Persons present (first, middle and family names of third parties);
